To Mrs. Gale and Mr. Griffin,

After speaking to both parents verbally in person, they have both stated that they are amenable to week-end visits commencing on an every other weekend basis. This has been the traditional arrangement for the majority of James' life. According to Ms. Gale this was the original order, although according to the attorneys' research, there is no record of this being ratified nor signed by a Judge. An agreement could not be reached by the parents concerning when these week-ends should begin.

The first weekend will start on October 1st. and end October 3rd., to alternate on an every other weekend basis. Mr. Griffin is to pick up James at 4:30p.m. at his mothers home on Friday. Mrs. Gale is to pick up James at his fathers home at 4:00p.m. on Sunday. This is to maintain the continuity of relationship that has begun to be reestablished between James and his father.

Constant supervision by Mr. Griffin's wife is no longer seen as necessary, as James safety is not at stake and that he needs to have some time alone with his father to increase the father/ son bonding that he has lacked for the past four months. There is not any type of potential endangerment seen concerning James and his father. This is primarily based of the report of the anger assessment specialist, psychological testing, and observations of the parties by this advocate.

A Special Advocate's report is forthcoming to give substance, credence and an establishment of the facts concerning James, these actions and future actions. All psychological data, drug testing, anger assessment and evaluation reports et.al., will be discussed and published. In the case of the anger assessment report it will be copied in toto and presented in the advocacy report. All other data collected by this advocate will be documented. This report will not be published until all fees are paid in full.

This advocate is available to either party and their attorney upon the agreement of opposing counsel. This same availability is also offered to both parties and their attorneys simultaneously at anytime.


